
TRUCK DRIVER TRAINING PROGRAM

The objective of MTA School's truck driver training program is to provide the training required to qualify a graduate for employment as a tractor trailer driver in interstate and/or intrastate commerce. A full-time student will be scheduled for 480 hours, 48 clock hours per week; 10 weeks (day); 24 weeks (weekend).

The training addresses three major areas:




of Transportation, Federal Motor Carrier Safety Rules and Regulations, preparation and maintenance of the driver's daily log, vehicle nomenclature and familiarization, Hazardous Materials training, Commercial Drivers' License state licensing requirements, specialized equipment in the industry, economy driving, motor carrier operations, highway characteristics, vehicle inspections, air brake systems, drug and alcohol awareness. Examinations are required throughout all phases of the classroom portion. The National Safety Council's intensive Defensive Driver Course is also delivered during this segment of training.

PART B. Skills and Backing: Abilities are developed in straight line, sight side, and blind side backing, as well as parallel parking and off-set alley maneuvers.

PART C. Over-the-Road: Training provides individual, behind-the-wheel driving while allowing ample time for each student to observe and learn from the performance of other drivers. Training routes are selected based on progressive degree of difficulty enabling the student to acquire all skills necessary relating to efficient mechanical operation, traffic patterns, thorough-fare configuration, terrain, and above all, SAFETY. This segment of training also places emphasis upon safe and efficient pre and post-trip requirements, such as proper coupling procedures, pretrip inspection (circle of safety), post-trip inspection and uncoupling procedures.
