Upon a review of the NPRM and comments by those persons and organizations most familiar with the issues, I have concluded that the proposed rules would cause significant and undue harm to a significant portion of the aviation community, without demonstratable benefit.

The potential abuse of the authority granted by the NPRM is significant, and the use or abuse of such authority would appear to unfairly and improperly impinge upon the rights of citizens (pilots) to lawfully pursue their occupation. While safety of operations is, and always has been, of major significance to pilots, public, and the FAA, simple concerns about such safety issues are an insignificant reason to institute such a broad and potentially damaging regulation. Additional study is called for, to (1) determine the goal of such regulation, and (2) to determine if additional regulation is actually call for. Thank you for the opportunity to comment.
