

Headlights, particularly those mounted high on pickup trucks and SUVs, cause visibility problems for me on a nightly basis. I drive home from work after dark in my 1994 Mazda Miata, and the headlights from trucks behind me cause extreme glare on the rear-view and driver's-side mirrors. This makes the mirrors virtually useless at night, and sometimes the glare is bright enough to disrupt forward vision.

Although they don't cause as many problems as pickups and SUVs, the extremely bright blue-colored lights from cars traveling in the opposite direction are sometimes blinding, even on low-beam.
