

NPRM 2003-14293 allows the FAA to remove my right to fly an airplane without any reasonable due process. This allows the TSA to simply declare any US citizen a security risk, and direct the FAA to revoke their flight privileges, with no evidence presented, and even no information to that person on why they are considered a security risk. This flies in the face of the protections of rights that Americans expect and believe in. There is absolutely nothing to stop the TSA from doing this arbitrarily, with no reason. This could deprive a person of their livelihood for absolutely no reason. It appears to be a continuation of the unreasonable crack-down on general aviation, even though general aviation has NEVER been identified as the cause of any major terrorist activity in the US. It is entirely improper for the TSA to have the power, without review or oversight, to deprive US citizens of a right they have come to expect, especially since there have been no general aviation terrorist activities.
