

I understand the need for increased security in the war on terrorism. This rule, as implemented, would violate the 5th Amendment of the Constitution, which states among other things that no person will "be deprived of life, liberty, or property, without due process of law". It also violates the 6th Amendment of the Constitution, which states among other things that persons "shall be informed of the nature and cause of the accusation; to be confronted with the witnesses against him, and have compulsory process for obtaining witnesses in his favor, and to have Assistance of Counsel for his defense".

I can see instances where an error in data would result in loss of livelihood and employment with no means of correcting the error, much less identifying it.
