ORDER REVOKING FOREIGN CERTIFICATE

By Order 2004-4-16, issued 4/20/04, we revoked for reason of dormancy the interstate scheduled passenger certificate of public convenience and necessity issued to Express One International, Inc. (Express One) by Order 98-7-6.

By this order, we are revoking the company's companion foreign scheduled passenger certificate authority for reason of dormancy. Instead of repeating our findings and conclusions in Order 2004-4-16, we incorporate them here by reference.

ACCORDINGLY,

1. We revoke the certificate of public convenience and necessity issued to Express One International, Inc., by Order 95-8-27, authorizing it to engage in foreign scheduled air transportation of persons, property, and mail.
2. Unless disapproved by the President of the United States under section 41307 of Title 49 of the United States Code, this order shall become effective on the 61st day after its submission for section 41307 review or upon the date of receipt of advice from the President or his designee under Executive Order 12597 and implementing regulations that he or she does not intend to disapprove the Department's order under that section, whichever occurs earlier.¹

¹ This order was submitted for section 41307 review on April 20, 2004. On June 8, 2004, we received notification that the President's designee under Executive Order 12597 and implementing regulations did not intend to disapprove the Department's order.
