

I just read the TSA-2004-19147. I have a Belgian private pilot license since 1978 and a US private pilot license since 1995 (not based on the Belgian license).

This rule would require me to apply at least every two years for my biennial flight review. Or maybe every day because my friend and I mostly fly together (and my friend is a CFII)! Does this prohibit us to fly together? This is nonsense.

I can understand some security rules but this is overacting. The effect is also doubtful: a criminal with a foreign pilot license is also able to fly an airplane and make havoc. And a criminal without pilot license but able to drive a car may also steal a truck, load it full of explosives and make greater havoc.

Please, be reasonable and exempt current license holders for recurrent training or additional training in the same class of aircraft.

Note: there might also be (muslim) US people with bad intentions and a pilot license (I am a catholic and I fear islamic extremism as much as you do)
