ORDER REVOKING FOREIGN CERTIFICATE

By Order 2004-9-2, issued September 1, 2004, we revoked for reason of dormancy the interstate charter air transportation certificate issued to Air-Serv., Inc. d/b/a AirServ, d/b/a Indigo, L.L.C., and d/b/a New WorldAir Holdings, Inc., by Order 2000-8-10.

By this order, we are revoking a companion certificate issued by Order 2000-10-25 authorizing foreign charter air transportation of persons, property, and mail. Instead of repeating our findings and conclusions in Order 2004-9-2, we incorporate them here by reference.

ACCORDINGLY, Acting under authority assigned by the Department in its Regulations, 14 CFR 385.12:

1. We revoke the certificate of public convenience and necessity issued by Order 2000-10-25 to Air-Serv., Inc. d/b/a AirServ, d/b/a Indigo, L.L.C., and d/b/a New WorldAir Holdings, Inc., authorizing it to engage in foreign charter air transportation.
2. Unless disapproved by the President of the United States under 49 U.S.C. 41307, this order shall become effective on the 61st day after its submission for section 41307 review or upon the date of receipt of advice from the President or his designee under Executive Order 12597 and implementing regulations that he or she does not intend to disapprove the Department's order under that section, whichever occurs earlier.¹

¹ This order was submitted for section 41307 review on September 1, 2004. On October 21, 2004, we received notification that the President's designee under Executive Order 12597 and implementing regulations did not intend to disapprove the Department's order.

3. We will serve a copy of this order on the persons listed in Attachment A.

Persons entitled to petition the Department for review of this order, under 14 CFR 385.30 may file their petitions within 10 days of the service date of this order.

The action taken in this order shall be effective immediately and the filing of a petition for review shall not alter its effectiveness.
